

## REGINA'S ECONOMIC BRIEFING

## Continuing the positive momentum

The Greater Regina Region experienced a modest slowdown in the year-over-year rate of employment growth from 1.1% in April to 0.6% in May. Unemployment remains low at 4.6%, suggesting that full employment is near. Employment growth was driven by professional, scientific, and technical services and full-time jobs.

## 900 new jobs created

Average year-to-date total employment in the Greater Regina Region was up 0.6% or 900 positions in May 2023 over the same period in 2022. At the provincial level, average year-to-date employment increased by 8,840 or 1.6%.

## **Population Growth**

Regina Census Metropolitan Area population was up 4,429 or 1.7 % from 264,375 in 2022 to 268,804 in 2023. The largest contributor to population growth was international in-migration as border restrictions eased post-pandemic.

## Solid GDP Growth

The Conference Board of Canada forecasts Regina's real GDP to increase by 2.6% in 2023 after advancing by 4.8% in 2022 and 3.1% in 2021. Real GDP is estimated to have dropped by 5.1% in 2020.

#### Interest rate hike

On June 7, the Bank of Canada raised its benchmark interest rate by .25 basis points to 4.75 per cent. This is the first time Canada's central bank has raised its trend-setting interest rate since January.

# Weaker home prices due to slow demand






#### **Labour Force Analysis**

#### A closer look at 2022 numbers

- By the first quarter of 2022, Regina's employment hit 142,400, fully recovering the roughly 23,000 jobs it lost during the COVID downturn. The previous peak was a record high of 141,975 people, set in the second quarter of 2019.
- For all of 2022, employment rose by 2,775 positions or 2.0 per cent. Absolute gains were led by a nearly 2,400-person rebound in accommodation and food services employment, although this sector has not yet recouped its pandemic-induced losses.
- All told, Regina's employment in 2022 was 10 per cent higher (12,800 jobs) than it was 10 years earlier.
